It's a paid job

An apprenticeship is a paid job where you benefit from structured training whilst gaining valuable workplace experience. There are thousands of top-quality options out there now, with many apprenticeships and degree apprenticeships in leading companies, and paying competitive salaries.



You get high quality training

Apprenticeships help people to get the necessary skills and experience to succeed in their chosen career.

An apprenticeship includes:

- paid employment with holiday leave
- hands-on-experience
- at least 6 hours off-the-job training per week on average
- formal assessment which leads to a nationally recognised certificate



The wide range of choices on offer

There have never been [so many great apprenticeship options available](#) in such a diverse range of sectors, going right up to degree level. There's something for everyone – from school leavers to those looking to upskill in their careers, and those seeking a career change.



It's rewarding

Apprenticeships can unlock doors for people, and they can be lucrative. Many world-class careers have been built on a solid apprenticeship. The good news is that [91% of apprentices](#) go on to secure employment or go on to further study after completing their training.



APPRENTICESHIP AMBASSADOR NETWORK (AAN)

The AAN is a dynamic group of volunteers consisting of over 2,300 employers and apprentices who are all passionate advocates for apprenticeships and skills. They use their enthusiasm and trusted expertise to encourage greater numbers of employers to connect with apprenticeships; while inspiring young people to view apprenticeships as a pathway for progression and success.

If you are a current or a former apprentice, we want you to join our network!

We need more enthusiastic skills champions to invest their time and energy showing young people an apprenticeship can open doors to a wide range of exciting and vibrant careers. The AAN has a powerful mantra: You can't be what you can't see.

We need brilliant role models who have achieved success in their apprenticeships to influence young people on the remarkable opportunities apprenticeships offer. We know apprenticeships transform lives; enabling individuals to prosper at work while gaining skills and confidence to help outside of work.

The AAN has a significant footprint in every region of the country. Membership comprises of local and national employers from businesses of all-sizes; representing every sector of the economy.

The network has 2 strategic objectives. Firstly, to connect an ambassador to every state secondary school and FE college in England. Today, the AAN has engaged with 79% of schools and colleges – that's almost 2,800 educational institutions! Ambassadors share their compelling personal stories and apprenticeship experiences to help students understand the impact that apprenticeships can make on their futures.

Secondly, the AAN has set out to buddy/mentor 3,000 SMEs as they recruit and train their new apprentices. Today the AAN has achieved 61% of its target.

On Apprentice Wednesday of NAW, the AAN will link with key players such as the Careers and Enterprise Company, local Career Hubs, and BBC Bitesize to visit thousands of young people in schools to excite them on apprenticeships. We will inform, influence, and inspire students, teachers, and parents so they know apprenticeships can be 'Plan A'. You can make a difference by changing the mindsets of young people to seize an apprenticeship! Join the AAN!
